

Introduction

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), also known as Global Goals, are a set of 17 integrated and interrelated goals to end poverty, protect the planet and ensure that humanity enjoys peace and prosperity by 2030.

India is home to more than a quarter of the hungry people in the world. The effect of climate change on agriculture will adversely affect Indian agriculture, thereby making food availability scarce. The existing production levels barely manage to keep pace with the growing population, a problem that is aggravated by high disparities in resources and purchasing power.

The changing scenario of rising food prices has raised new concerns about food security. It has been estimated that globally 130 million more people have become food insecure due to high food prices, climate change, and war zones in addition to the existing 850 million. Soaring prices would require providing top priority to ensuring access to food by the most vulnerable, which can be achieved through expanded safety net programs such as the PDS, and those programs which address the nutritional status of pregnant and lactating women, and children of less than five years of age.



An Overview

Education is a human right, a powerful driver of development, and one of the strongest instruments for reducing poverty and improving health, gender equality, peace, and stability. It delivers large, consistent returns in terms of income, and is the most important factor to ensure equity and inclusion.

Inclusive development hinges upon ensuring quality education. Proper schooling prepares individuals for social and civic responsibility, builds social capital and encourages effective cognitive development.

Education and literacy are the key indicators of a society that play a central role in enhancing overall socio-economic development of a country as a whole. Emphasising the education as the essence of human resource development, the Government of India is likely to finalise the New Education Policy (NEP) through consultative process.

To meet the changing dynamics of the present day requirement with regard to quality education, innovation and research, NEP aims to make India a knowledge hub by equipping its students with skill development and up gradation including ICT and vocational training.

Why does quality education matter?

Education enables upward socioeconomic mobility and is a key to escaping poverty. Quality education helps reduce inequalities and reach gender equality and is crucial to fostering tolerance and more peaceful societies.

Over the past decade, major progress has been made towards increasing access to quality education and school enrollment rates at all levels, particularly for girls. Nevertheless, about 258 million children and youth were still out of school in 2018 – nearly one fifth of the global population in that age group.



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Nims Institute of Humanities and Liberal Arts

Nims Institute of Humanities and Liberal Arts, a concerted effort is underway to promote Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with a specific focus on 'Quality Education.'

On 19th February 2024, students from the Department of English, Political Science, Geography, Sociology, and Social Work visited a Senior Secondary School in Achrol. Their objective was to raise awareness among students about the real value of quality education through a series of activities.

Led by Dr. Suresh, Head of the English Department, the students performed a skit divided into three segments. The skit addressed crucial themes:

Additionally, a quiz focusing on Quality Education was conducted. Students from the 7th to 12th standards enthusiastically participated and voluntarily answered questions related to quality education, showcasing their knowledge and engagement with the subject.



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Activity-2

A Study of Everyday Life in Primary School Village-Peelwa, Tehsil- Amer, District-Jaipur, Rajasthan

Objective:

- To study the functioning of the government school on **23rd February 2024** to understand the availability of resources and facilities provided to students and teachers.
- To assess whether each student is receiving equal education in subjects such as English, Hindi, Maths, Sanskrit, Social Sciences, Science, and Moral Education.

School Overview:

- Moderate size with 5 classes, 1 office, and 1 temple.
- Early Childhood Development (ECD) class for children aged 4-6.
- Total Students: 70.
- Age Group: 9-15 years (44 students).
- Classes: Standards 4 to 8.
- Teachers: 7.

Report Description:

On 23rd February 2024, NIMS University Social Work students conducted observational research in Peelwa village. The primary focus was on understanding the functioning of the primary and secondary schools.

Government-run with Mid-Day meal facilities, providing nutritious meals to all students regardless of caste. Breakfast includes milk and bananas, while lunch comprises dal, rice, roti, and khichdi.

Facilities and Observations:

The school provides sanitary napkins and iron capsules to menstruating girls, ensuring their health and breaking menstrual taboos.

The infrastructure is in poor condition: inadequate lighting, dirty blackboards, and unsanitary conditions.

Critical issues include the lack of proper sanitation facilities, with unsafe and unhygienic toilets, and poor quality drinking water, which poses health risks to students.

Village Insights:

Geographical Area: 447 hectares.

Population: 1,935 (1,018 males, 917 females).

Literacy Rate: 49.20% (63.16% males, 33.70% females).

Houses: 356.

Limited shops and no transport facilities.

Basic medical needs require travel to Chandwaji.

Poor water quality, with reliance on water tanks.

Presence of multiple temples but no mosque, indicating a low Muslim population.



- Rice - 1 kg - Rs. 50
- Lentils (Daal) mix - 1 kg - Rs. 120
- Mustard oil - 1 Litre from Tagore brand - Rs. 60
- Salt - 1 kg from Soorya brand - Rs. 10
- Turmeric (Haldi) powder - 100 g - Rs. 20
- White sweetener powder (Boora) - 500 g - Rs. 25
- Red chilli powder - 100 g - Rs. 30
